Hortonville Public Library

Unattended Child Policy

Purpose and scope: The Hortonville Public Library (herein referred to as "Library") strives to provide a welcoming environment that encourages all patrons to use library resources and facilities. However, the Library places the responsibility of children using the library with the caregiver/guardian. The purpose of this policy is to ensure the safety and well-being of all children using the library.

- 1. The Library is not equipped, nor is it the Library's role, to provide long-term or short-term childcare.
- 2. While the Hortonville Public Library staff will always respond with care and concern, the library assumes no responsibility for the care and/or supervision of children.
 - a. Parents, caregivers, and/or guardians are reminded that unexpected events can occur while children are left at the Library and the Library is open to everyone.
- 3. Children under the age of 8 must be accompanied by a parent, guardian and/or designated caregiver while in the library.
- 4. If children under 8 years of age are attending a library program, the Library requires the parent and/or designated guardian to remain on the library premises throughout the program.
- 5. Library staff members reserve the right to notify parents and/or designated guardians regarding improper behavior of children if no steps are taken by the child to correct behaviors after a warning has been given.
- 6. Any child requiring repeated intervention by library staff or who are violating the Code of Conduct policy may be asked to leave.

- 7. To ensure the safety of unattended children, library staff members also reserve the right to contact law enforcement should the need arise in extreme cases.
- 8. Library staff will make a reasonable effort to ensure that children leave the Library comfortably and safely at closing time. At least two staff members will remain at the Library if a minor child remains on the premises after closing. If any children remain at the Library 15-20 minutes after closing, staff will contact the Hortonville Police Department and they will assume responsibility for the child.
- 9. Children 8 years of age and over who can maintain proper library behavior (as noted in the Code of Conduct policy) may use the library unattended.
 - a. The Library will assume that a responsible parent, caregiver, and/or guardian are knowledgeable that the child is present at the library if the child is unattended and age 8 or older.
